ORDER RE: MOTION FOR ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE RE CONTEMPT FOR DEFENDANTS' VIOLATION OF PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION

THIS MATTER comes before the Court on Plaintiffs' Motion for Order to Show Cause Re Contempt for Defendants' Violation of Preliminary Injunction. The Court has reviewed the materials submitted in connection with the Motion, including redacted and un-redacted papers. The Court hereby ORDERS as follows:

- 1. Plaintiffs' Motion is GRANTED as follows.
- No later than 15 days following entry of this order—to the extent not already produced—Zillow shall produce all communications related to the creation, distribution, and/or implementation of the Samuelson Memo, together with a privilege log specifically identifying any such documents and portion of documents being withheld and the basis for the withholding.

- 3. No later than 30 days following entry of this order, Zillow shall produce for deposition all Zillow employees involved in the creation, distribution, and/or implementation of the Samuelson Memo. Each such examination shall not exceed three hours and shall be limited to the subject matter of this order. These depositions shall not be counted against the total allowed under the applicable civil rules.
- 4. At 1:30 p.m., on April 24, 2015, defendants are ordered to show cause:
  - a. Why they should not be held in contempt for violation of the court's preliminary injunction entered June 30, 2014; and
  - b. What orders and/or sanctions, if any, are appropriate under these circumstances.
- 5. The briefing schedule in connection with the above hearing is as follows:
  - a. Plaintiffs' opening brief is due Monday, March 30, 2015;
  - b. Defendants' response brief is due Monday, April 6, 2015; and
  - c. Plaintiffs' reply is due Friday, April 10, 2015.
